Southeast Oregon had humidity drop into the teens and even a single digit was recorded. Winds were light to breezy with gust in the teens and 20s. There were gusts in the upper 30s in the Kittitas Valley. West side temperatures ranged from the 60s along the coast to the 70s and 80s inland. The lowest humidity was 29 in southwest Oregon but higher elsewhere. Winds were light in western Washington, but western Oregon had higher winds with gusts in the 20s. Light precipitation occurred in northwest Oregon, western Washington, and the Washington Cascades. Trace amounts were recorded in the Blue Mountains. There was no lightning.
