Temperatures were in the upper 80s and 90s on the west side of the Cascades, 90s on the east side, and 50s along the coast. Relative humidities on the west side were in the the 20s and 30s with occasional single digits on the east side. Poor relative humidity gust in the 20s. Initial attack activity was moderate. There was scattered precipitation in the Oregon Cascades with most locations receiving less than 0.05". Lightning was moderate with over 1000 strikes centered on the Oregon Cascades. The Sunbanks fire in central Washington grew to 100 acres.
