WEATHER HIGHLIGHT

Temperatures were in the 80s to low 90s across the Geographic Area. Relative humidity dropped to the teens east of the Cascades and remained above 30 percent for the west side. Winds were breezy with gusts up to the mid-30s in southeast Oregon. Light lightning across eastern Washington and northeast Oregon was accompanied by scattered precipitation across northern and central Washington. Initial attack was light with one fire growing Washington and one growing to 1,000 acres in southwest Oregon. Existing large fires continued to exhibit active fire behavior.
