WEATHER HIGHLIGHT

High temperatures east of the Cascades were in the 80s to high 90s, west of the Cascades temperatures were in the 70s to low 80s. Minimum relative humidities in eastern Oregon were in the teens with single digits in the Harney Basin. In eastern Washington minimum humidities were in the low 20s. Humidities were above 40 for the rest of the Geographic Area. Windy conditions occurred east of the Cascades. Very heavy lightning occurred across the Cascades, western Oregon and Washington. Scattered lightning occurred in eastern Washington and northeast Oregon. Widespread wetting rain occurred across western Oregon and Washington with numerous stations in the Cascades reporting over one inch. Scattered light rain occurred in eastern Washington and northeast Oregon. Initial attack was moderate. The Reinbold fire in Washington grew to 170 acres and a County Assist Fire east of Arlington Oregon grew to 6,000 acres. Existing large fires exhibited low fire behavior.
