High temperatures east of the Cascades were in the 80s to low 90s. West of the Cascades temperatures were in the 70s to low 80s. Minimum relative humidities in east of the Cascades were in the single digits to low 20s. Humidities were above 30 for the rest of the Geographic Area. Breezy conditions occurred east of the Cascades with higher gusts through the Cascade Gaps and Harney Basin. Light to moderate lightning occurred in northwest Oregon and western Washington. Lightning was accompanied by moderate to heavy precipitation west of I-5 and light precipitation elsewhere. Initial attack was moderate. Active fire behavior occurred in eastern Oregon and Washington with four fires reaching large fire status. Existing large fires exhibited moderate fire behavior.
