**WEATHER HIGHLIGHT**

Temperatures were in the 80-90s for most of the geographic area with a few areas reaching 100. Relative humidity dropped into the teens and 20s on the east side and in southwest Oregon while the remainder of the west side stayed above 30 percent. Winds were breezy with gusts into the mid-30s in southeast Oregon and north central Washington. Moderate lightning amounts east of I-5 in Oregon and southern Washington were accompanied by strong outflow winds. Scattered precipitation fell in eastern Washington, light to moderate precipitation in central and northeastern Oregon. Initial attack was light with two starts in grass central Oregon growing over 400 acres. Existing large fires showed light growth.
