**WEATHER HIGHLIGHT**

Hot, dry, and unstable weather will shift mainly to the east side on Saturday as a gradual cooling trend begins. Mostly dry thunderstorms are expected mostly over central and northeastern Oregon today and Sunday before shifting out of the area Sunday night. A thermal trough west of the Cascades this morning will drift eastward into the Cascades keeping the poor overnight humidity recovery going until Sunday when cooler air with more moisture begins working inland from the coast. General winds will begin increasing on Sunday along the east slopes of the Cascades as the cooling trend continues. Some light rain may be possible by midweek next week.
