WEATHER HIGHLIGHT

Afternoon temperatures were in the 70s in the Columbia Basin and 50s to 60s across the rest of the geographic area. Afternoon relative humidities were in the 20s to 30s in the Columbia and Harney Basins and above 50 elsewhere. Winds were breezy with stronger gusts through the Cascade Gaps. No lightning was recorded. Scattered light precipitation was received in western Oregon and Washington. Light to moderate precipitation was recorded in northeast Oregon and southeast Washington. Initial attack was light. Fire behavior was low to moderate.
