WEATHER HIGHLIGHT

Afternoon temperatures were in the 70s and 80s in the lower elevations and 60s elsewhere. Minimum relative humidities were in the teens and 20s in the lower elevations of eastern Oregon and above 30 across the remainder of the Geographic area. Winds were breezy with higher gusts in central Oregon and through the Cascade gaps. Isolated to scattered lightning was recorded in the central Washington Cascades, northwest and central Washington. Light to moderate precipitation was received in western and northern Washington as well as northwest Oregon. Initial attack was light. Fire behavior was moderate to active on uncontained portions of existing large fires.
