Low pressure exits east while another upper trough moves over the region through Wednesday. It brings rain to the western PSAs with light showers to eastern Oregon. Moderately strong west winds push through the Cascade gaps and into the lower Basin, however, humidity remains elevated. Offshore high pressure begins building Wednesday and attempts to push inland through the weekend. However, how this upper ridge evolves remains rather uncertain through early next week. Drier and weaker westerly gap winds periodically occur later this week and weekend.
