Skies were clear and dry across the Geographic Area. High temperatures were in the 60-70s across most of the area with southwest Oregon reaching into the 80s. Relative humidity remained above 30 percent on the west side, dropped to single digits in southeastern Oregon, and stayed in the teens to 20s for the remainder of the east side and southwest Oregon. Poor overnight humidity recovery in Oregon. Winds were breezy across the region gusting to 40 mph in southwest Oregon. No lightning was recorded. Initial attack was light with the largest growing to 6 acres in eastern Washington. Uncontained portions of existing large fires showed moderate to active fire behavior.
