Yesterday's weak front will dissipate over the region today. A moderately strong cold front crosses over the region Wednesday bringing soaking rains to most of western Oregon and Washington and the far northeast Oregon mountains. Rain and snow showers continue Thursday and into Friday along with a chance of wet thunderstorms across the region. The Cascade rain shadow will continue to minimize precipitation for the Columbia Basin, high deserts and rangelands as those areas may struggle to receive wetting precipitation. West winds under cooler temperatures and higher humidities will become moderately stronger at times Wednesday and Thursday east of the Cascades.
