WEATHER HIGHLIGHT

Today and tomorrow brings continued multi-inch soaking rain for western Washington with some spill over to the Cascade east slopes. Lower amounts expected for western Oregon though locally up to an inch by Monday morning. Relatively little rain expected for most eastside areas though the eastern mountains could get a decent wetting rain and high elevation snow as a cold front eventually crosses Sunday night and Monday. Breezy winds expected Sunday and Monday surrounding the cold front. Low pressure cuts off the northern California coast next week resulting in cooler temperatures and mainly dry weather. The cut off low then comes across the Pacific NW either Thursday or Friday bringing dry gusty winds across eastern Oregon.
